Naming of Bannockburn Reserve

Central Otago District Council is asking for feedback about a proposed name for the currently unnamed walking track between Lynn Lane (off Hall Road) and Schoolhouse Road in Bannockburn.

The name put forward is "Campbell Lane" to commemorate Flight Lieutenant Colin Campbell, who was lost in a raid over France during World War II. James Lynn, who also died in the war, has a nearby street named after him.

The Cromwell Community Board approved the proposal at the August meeting.

Plumbosolvency: Why You Should Flush Your Taps!

Most drinking water in Aotearoa New Zealand is plumbosolvent. This means the water can dissolve small amounts of metals it may encounter, such as lead and copper in your plumbing fittings (like pipes and taps). This is most likely to happen when water stands for several hours, for example overnight.

Drinking water with high levels of heavy metal is a health concern. Although the health risk is small, the Ministry of Health recommends that you flush a large cupful of water from your drinking tap each morning before use to remove any metals that may have dissolved from the plumbing fittings. You should also do this at other times when your tap has not been used for a while, like when you come back from holiday.

All households are advised to take this precaution, whether they are on public or private water supply.
