Applications close 12 January 2025.



'Tis the season to be jolly, and the season when we often produce high levels of waste. With Christmas fast approaching, it's a good reminder of what goes in your bins.

YELLOW BINS:

Yellow kerbside mixed recycling bins only take:

Clean and dry paper and cardboard **Empty** aluminium drink cans, **clean** steel food cans

Rigid plastic grocery packaging

These plastics should have a 1, 2 or 5 on them and are the sorts of bottles, containers and trays you would find in the kitchen, bathroom and laundry.

We are starting to see high levels of contamination in some yellow bins – that means non-recyclable items going in the bin (some examples pictured).













COMMON ERRORS IN YELLOW BINS

Shoes, broken plastic household items such as baby seats or garden hoses must go in the **RED BIN**. If any items are too large to fit in the red bin they must be taken to a transfer station.

Oversized items (remember items more than 3L in size are not accepted and need to go in RED BIN - or taken to transfer station if too large to fit in **RED BIN**)

Hazardous chemicals (garden spray containers cannot be recycled – please rinse three times and place in **RED BIN** or take to transfer station)

All soft plastic needs to be **DROPPED OFF AT A STORE** that offers a soft plastic recycling service

Food scraps (**GREEN BIN** only)

General rubbish, dust and dirt, and nappies are not acceptable (these must go in the **RED BIN**)
