Exploration drilling for potential drinking water source to commence in Ranfurly

At the end of this month, the Central Otago District Council will be drilling a few exploration bores along the Ranfurly Back Road.

The aim of this investigation is to understand the geology of the location for a potential new drinking water source for the Ranfurly town supply.

The Ranfurly town supply currently sources its water from Eweburn Creek.

The contractor is scheduled to begin work on 29 October 2024 and it will take up to three weeks to complete the exploration.

There will be some minor traffic management in place in the form of traffic cones to mark the drilling area, without disruptions to traffic.

Moa Flat Road

Ida Valley - Omakau bridge closed

Due to recent flooding, one of the abutments of the Omakau bridge has been damaged. For the safety of all road users, the bridge was closed last Friday and will remain so for approximately three weeks while repairs are undertaken the damage is investigated.

Detours:

- Light vehicles: Please use the Ophir Bridge via Swindon Street / Ophir Bridge Road.
- Heavy/long vehicles: Must detour via SH85, as the Ophir Bridge is unsuitable for heavy traffic and long vehicles. The bridge has a 5 Tonne axle weight limit.

Waenga Drive - PARTIAL TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE EXTENDED - between Cairnmuir Crescent up to Murray Terrace, Cromwell

Due to unforeseen circumstances with the utilities underground, the Foodstuffs/New World Cromwell development project on Waenga Drive will overrun by 14-21 days, possibly into late November.
