#### I / We seek the following decision from the consent authority:

There are a couple of details I would like the committee to consider.

- CODC to provide the regulatory framework for future access to our properties. e.g. making my shared driveway an unformed legal road.
- CODC to consider "widening the right of way." from Waldron road through to 37 Hillview Road and the shared driveway for 37, 36, 35 Hillview Road Conways and Hamiltons properties.
- CODC to support connectivity. Essentially this means that William Hill Estate, or any single subdivision, is not considered in isolation, and that the plan change incorporates measures to help open up large lot residential zones in our area (Waldron Road, Hillview Road) for development.
- \*Connectivity in this situation could apply with respect to services and access. Not just vehicle access, but potentially also walking and cycling trails.
- Connectivity becomes highly relevant my 'land-locked' property with challenging access issues. Failure to properly address and allow for connectivity stands to impede development efforts and therefore defeats the purpose of making more land available for housing.
- I would like the rules in the plan to ensure connectivity is available, in terms of services and walking, cycling and road access e.g. via William Hill Estate or Waldron Road.
- Large lots ( such as my block) are physically restrained by rights of way at this time.
- It could be useful for connectivity to be created with adjoining blocks to make them feasible for development as connectivity will help to realise the anticipated vision for the district plan change and more housing development options. Opening the door on all possibilities, I believe it would be prudent to take a broad and inclusive approach if possible.
