I oppose the change from the Rural Resource Area to a development for urban activities for the following reasons:

Access onto State Highway 6
 The Sandflat Road-State Highway 6 intersection is dangerous.

#### 2. Noise

Noise is a constant at Highlands Motorsport Park. The race track is in use throughout the year. It can be heard most days in the background within much of Cromwell township. Being close to Highlands and the stock car track will be a continual irritation if anyone were to live in the proposed sub-division. Those who initially buy the sections may accept this as part of their neighbourhood, but pursuant buyers in years to come will expect a quiet space, and will complain loud and long about the noise. This area should be kept rural/commercial. Highlands is unique to our community and valued for its presence. And its existence depends on a rural setting.

3. Chemicals and Proximity to orchards
Proposed houses would be very close to large orchards. People who are not familiar with
orchard operations do not realise the large amount of spraying which goes on throughout the
year in the production of fruit. They will buy sections, build houses, and at a later date realise
the health impact. Then they will rightly apportion blame for issues such as asthma, eczema
etc on the chemical and organic (also harmful) orchard sprays and spray drift from the orchards
across the fence and over the road.

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
