My submission is:

I strongly oppose the proposed plan 13 change for the following reasons:

I have strong concerns regarding how the proposed development can be a realistic option with a motorsport park, speedway and orchards on its doorstep. As far as I am aware, the development has made little effort to protect the surrounding businesses that it intends to be neighbours with. Highlands, Central Speedway and the surrounding orchards all stand to be affected if the proposed development goes ahead. I hope that the council has the foresight to see that this development cannot live harmoniously with its neighbours in the proposed location. There will be a flow on effective to these businesses which are already operating legally and within their consents and continue to promote the growth of the Cromwell area.

Highlands is a fantastic employer and because of my employment there, I have been able to afford to stay in the Central Otago area. As a single mother bringing up 3 school age children, it is sometimes difficult to keep a head above water especially in a region experiencing such rapid growth. With property prices constantly on the rise, finding a reasonably priced rental property that is affordable on one wage is next to impossible let alone trying to get on the property ladder myself. From working for Highlands, I can attest to the countless donations given to worthy local causes each month and the continuous support of the Central Otago Hockey Club and Cromwell Swimming Club.

Highlands has spent considerable time and money building a reputable business in Cromwell and continues to grow from strength to strength. With an eye always to the future, Highlands is constantly striving to find ways to bring more visitors to the region.

The Central Speedway is another long term feature of the region which looks to be disadvantaged by the proposed development. The Speedway brings so many fans to the region for every race meeting they hold and is always a crowd pleaser. They provide a family friendly atmosphere that many locals enjoy and brings many people into the area.

I vehemently oppose the proposed plan change and believe that the council has an obligation to the current surrounding businesses to decline the developer's submission in its entirety.
