SIR,—

Inconvenience has been found to arise from the fact that in some instances special orders made by County Councils, merging road districts and town districts, have not been published in the *New Zealand Gazette*. It is quite true that "The Counties Act, 1886," does not apparently require that these special orders should be gazetted, but it is nevertheless very desirable that the Government and the public should be informed thereof. I am therefore directed by the Colonial Secretary to request that you will be good enough to forward to this department a sealed copy of all special orders merging road districts or town districts which may have been passed since the 1st January, 1887, or which may in future be passed by your Council, in order that they may be published in the *Gazette* for general information.
