

AH CHAW - miner of Kyeburn, died in Naseby hospital 13<sup>th</sup> November 1894, aged 48 years. Native of China.

AH CHEONG - died 12<sup>th</sup>. November 1900 in Naseby following an incurable illness of 5-6 years.

AH CHUNG – native of Canton, storekeeper of Naseby, killed in a coach accident, Iveson's coach, at Saddle Hill March 1875 aged about 35 years, buried in Dunedin.

AH FOOK - miner of Naseby, died aged 65 years at the Naseby Hospital 29<sup>th</sup>. July 1905, aged 65 years. Native of China.

AH FU - miner of Naseby, died in Naseby hospital 21<sup>st</sup> September 1898, aged 68 years. Native of China.

AH GUNN - miner, killed by a large fall of earth while working his claim at Naseby, 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1868, age about 32 years. Inquest heard 3/9 in the Victoria Hotel, Naseby, by H. W. Robinson, Resident Magistrate and Coroner

AH HAW – miner of Spec Gully, died in Naseby Hospital 24<sup>th</sup> April 1905, aged 53 years. Native of China.

AH HOW – died in Naseby hospital 24<sup>th</sup> April 1906

AH HUEN: died en route to Queenstown in back of a wagon at Pigroot Creek Hotel 14<sup>th</sup> August 1871. Had arrived from China eight days before.

AH KEM - miner, aged 37 years, killed by a quantity of earth falling on him while mining at Naseby, 5<sup>th</sup> September 1872. Inquest held in Bendigo Hotel, Naseby, by H. W. Robinson, Resident Magistrate and Coroner

AH KING – killed by fall of earth while working in Taradale Gully, Naseby, old tail race, 5<sup>th</sup> August 1872

AH LEE – originally from Canton, aged 24 years, hung in Dunedin prison, 5<sup>th</sup> November 1880, for murdering Mrs. Mary Young, Kyeburn. General opinion was he was not guilty.

AH SOON - miner aged about 30 years, body found on the ranges about a mile from Naseby, 13<sup>th</sup> March 1871. Inquest held at Royal Hotel by H. W. Robinson Esq. Resident Magistrate and Coroner. Verdict, died from natural causes accelerated by exposure to the weather.

AH SUN - found dead on spur beyond where Kyeburn road branches off to the left to Dunedin, 15<sup>th</sup> March 1871. Dr. McCambridge examined the body and declared death was by 'visitation of God.' Buried in Naseby cemetery.

AH WAH – died in Naseby 11<sup>th</sup> November 1900. Inquest 16/11

AH WING – killed immediately by a fall of earth while working his claim in Main Gully, Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> July 1882.

AH YAIK – miner aged about 40 years. Was on his way from Naseby to Dunedin hospital, having been forwarded from the former by subscription, for the purpose of treatment for dropsy. Died en-route at Taieri Lake Station, 5<sup>th</sup> February 1869. Inquest held at Palmerston, same date, by J. W. Murdoch, Esq. Resident Magistrate and Coroner

AH YET - miner of Naseby, died in Naseby hospital 27<sup>th</sup> March 1891, aged 48 years. Native of China.

BUN YAN: Joe – killed October 1898 by a fall of earth while working on his Kyeburn claim. Report 1/10, Obituary

CHIN GEE – aged 79 years, found dead in his hut in Home Gully 21<sup>st</sup> September 1920

by Constable Lemm, death estimated to have been four to five days previous.  
CHIN HUNG - killed by a fall of earth on claim in Home Gully, Naseby, 30<sup>th</sup> April 1891.

CHUN MOW - killed by a fall of earth, 27<sup>th</sup> June 1896, while working his claim, Home  
Gully. Report 3/8  
DY CHUNG: Mrs Mary - of Ophir, died in Naseby hospital 28<sup>th</sup> August 1899, aged 42  
years. Native of Scotland.  
FONG: Joe – storekeeper, died in Naseby 5<sup>th</sup> October 1903 – permission to remove  
remains from the cemetery given 26<sup>th</sup> September 1904, work to be carried out under  
supervision of the Sexton  
GIN MOA - miner of Upper Kyeburn, died in Naseby hospital 4<sup>th</sup> December 1898, aged  
71 years. Native of China.  
HOCK LYE - died at Naseby Hospital, from asthma, 3<sup>rd</sup> December 1892.  
MOH GIN: of Kyeburn, died in Naseby hospital, 3<sup>rd</sup> December 1898, aged 71 years  
SHO LEUNG SHUM [Joe Chum] – died from gunshot wounds inflicted when William  
Hardie robbed him, Upper Kyeburn, 17<sup>th</sup> July 1928, aged about 50 years.  
TOO FEE: George Henry – 17<sup>th</sup> January 1878 at Naseby eldest son of George Too Fee,  
aged 5 years.  
WANG ON - died in his hut Wet Gully, 27<sup>th</sup> July 1898.  
WONG HAP - miner of Naseby, died in Naseby hospital 28<sup>th</sup> August 1897, aged 57 years.  
Native of China.  
YOU HOI - miner of Spec Gully, died in Naseby hospital 14<sup>th</sup> August 1904, aged 70  
years. Native of China, been in New Zealand 40 years.
