Clyde November 26<sup>th</sup> /83

Report on Roads.

Clyde to Cromwell. In fair order.  
Ordinary repairs have been attended to.

Clyde to Gannons. In fair order but the ruts require filling up. At the lower end some slight damage was done by the heavy rain which fell about a week ago.

Clyde to Zander Creek. In good order. Part of the road near Hutton Town Gully was washed away and damaged to the extent of from £15 to £20. Two men are now employed putting it in repair. No other work has been done during the past two months.

Tinkers to Zander Creek. In good order. The amount voted by the County Council some time ago, for repairs, has been expended, and a considerable improvement made in the track.

Alexandria to Boundary. In good order. Ordinary repairs have been attended to, and in addition some four or five chains of road near Gorge Creek has been pitted and blinded with broken rock. Instructions were given to the surfaceman to improve a sharp turn on the hill the other side of Gorge Creek.

Clyde to Parcells. The Parcells Hill was much damaged by the late rain, and it will be necessary to put it in repair within the ensuing two months, so that the wool from Hawkburn Station may be got away. Between the top of the hill and the Woolshed repairs are also needed, and I would therefore recommend that the sum of £50 be voted for the purpose. The remaining portion of the road is in fair order with the exception of a small portion on the other side of the Bannockburn Creek.

Illa Valley Roads. In good order. Some trifling repairs have been made to the road passing "Garis" and to the German Hill road. The Poolburn Creek is still too

high to allow of the necessary  
repairs to the crossing before  
"class" being made. I am given  
to understand that some expenditure  
will be needed in one of the  
new blocks lately surveyed at  
the upper end of the Valley.

The road in question is a  
continuation of that between  
sections 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, 12, 13, 14  
15. Block & Ligu Hill. The  
necessity for the cutting arises from  
the fact that the track in  
former use is now fenced off.  
When I have inspected the ground  
I shall be enabled to report more  
fully upon the matter.

Blacks to Ida Valley. In fair order.  
No repairs have been made during  
the past two months.

Roads Spottis Hundred. Most of  
these are in good order. Repairs  
of a trifling character have been  
executed on some. The road  
between sections 41 and the Mining  
Reserve, is however in a bad  
state, and must be attended to  
immediately. The Spottis Creek,  
which at this point has no  
well defined channel, has broken  
over, and is now running on

the road itself. This occurred quite lately and I have not been able to visit the ground since, but I am of opinion that instead of trying to turn the water back again, which has already been done twice, it will be better to make a channel for it alongside the road, and convey it to a point further down where the creek crosses in a well defined channel. The expenditure of the deferred payment survey has not yet been commenced, but the work will be undertaken shortly.

Drybread to Upper Drybread. A small party of men are now at work on this track forming and otherwise improving, the expenditure being met out of the vote of Council.

Gowells to Wanaka. In good order. The two men who were working on the upper part of the road have completed the filling in of cuts and clearing stones and the track is now greatly improved. A party of men are now at work in Block IX, forming, and in some parts, graveling. The same party will do the work opposite the

Risa Station.

Cromwell to Ritterburn. In good order. Only one man is now employed. The scrub retaining walls have been completed and prove of great service. They have of course sunk somewhat with the slip, and indeed will continue to do so, but nevertheless they will still afford a foundation on which to place material for widening the road.

Cromwell to Nevins. In fair order. The surface man has been employed forming and graveling, and on ordinary maintenance repairs.

Zowburn to Rocky Pt. In good order.

Rocky Pt. to Bendigo and Nine.

The surface man from the last mentioned road was instructed to put in a crossing about half way between Dr. Zacharia's and Bendigo, and the work was set out for him. I believe it is not yet begun, but the present track is in good order.

Rocky St. to Gamma. In good order. A fresh occurred in the Loddie river which altered the crossing a good deal, and the surveyor from the "Lowburn to Rocky St" road was employed for some days putting it in order again.

Cromwell to Lowburn. There has been very little traffic on this road up to the present time and there will not be much until the turn at this end of the road has been made practicable.

Loddie Road. A party of men are now at work on this road. They have completed a deviation at the upper end of the Upper Gorge, and are now at work at the large wall mentioned in my former report.

The expenditure up to the end of this month will be about £50 and I do not think that the work can be done under my original estimate, viz £150.

The sum voted at last meeting was £75 and I would therefore recommend that the remaining £75 be now granted.

Clyde to Alexandria. In good order.  
In upper, or "Racecourse road",  
having been fenced off it became  
necessary to construct two culverts  
and from a small portion of  
the surveyed line, to render it  
passable. This has therefore been  
done.

Alexandria to Granortown. A party  
of men have been employed on  
this track, forming the road  
places, and breaking it passable  
for wheeled vehicles. The work is  
now well forward. Some damage  
was done to the new work by  
the late rain, but not of any  
great extent.

Alexandria to Gateside. This road  
was quite impassable, and is  
still only practicable for very light  
vehicles. In some of the gullies  
the banks together with the  
culverts, were quite washed away.  
*(50/- paid GLC)*  
The same party of men which was  
working on the road immediately  
preceding, are now on this track.  
I estimate the cost of repairs at  
£50 and would therefore recommend  
that this sum be voted.
