There are quite a number of hives of Bees close to the road, which runs from Sulpho to Ida Valley.

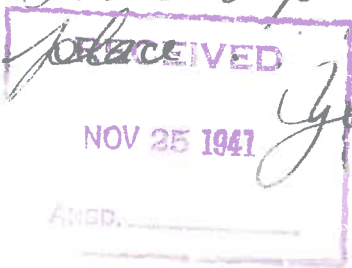
My little girl has to bike past them to school every day, and I am really afraid they may take to her some time during the hot weather.

It is flowing both sides of the bridge. It is not good enough there are 2 big holes in the creek & our car won't go through it. It is 9 1/2 miles around the main road & is too far for her to hike. We are going to be locked in all this winter by the lock at things, as both creeks are up & we have to pay rates & walk everywhere. I will have to write to the Education Board about getting her lessons sent to her. As she paddled through water all last winter & this summer. When it rains she can't even get to the foot bridge she has to swim around & come home again. Hoping something will be done

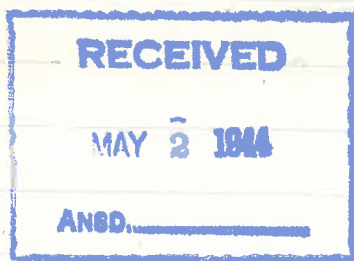
