Constable Nestor respectfully reports, that about a quarter of a mile from Clyde township at this side of the river going to Cromwell, close to the water's edge of the river there is the carcass of a red Cow. This dead animal is decaying causing a most unpleasant smell to persons passing along on the public road, and is also rather near to the township.

This place is a mining Reserve, Enquiries were made but unable to find an owner for it, no visible brands &c that would lead as to the ownership.

The Court requests that the property authorities be communicated with to have this nuisance abated as some of the outside public were complaining about it
