



## Vincent County Council – 1887-1893

### File A94 – Claims for Compensation

- Letter from John Chapple, Allandale Ophir informing the council that he is holding them responsible for any damage to his free hold lad, Sections 25 & 26 Block I Tiger Hill and Section 29 Block 3 Lauder from the overflow of the main tail race – 24 July 1893
- Letter to the Vincent County Council Engineer from Richard Olds? making claim after considering the road question, for the loss of approx. 50 acres of land, the 18 year lease, shifting the fence and putting down ?, finding water supply equal to the present supply – estimated at £292.10. Any less compensation and he informs the council that they can move the fence and find the water themselves. He is willing to go to arbitration to settle the thing – 9 May 1894

- Letter and legal opinion from  advising council in regard to an accident claim involving two employees – 21 April 1890
- Letter claiming compensation for a new road put through the writers lease hold land by council – 6 December 1889
- Letter from David Ferran re the compensation claim for damage to crop that is to put before council. He informs them that he will be represented by Mr James Wilson – April 1889
- Letter requesting compensation for extras paid for on contract 227, road Kawarau bridge to gorge road, over and above the tender due to unforeseen difficulties – 21 May 1889
- Claim for compensation of £12 paid by contractors, Kinney Brothers, contract 203 Ida Valley, for access to gravel on land originally thought to be Crown Land but turned out to be private. Amount was over and above the tender price – 30 July 1888
- Request for compensation re contract no.'s 171 and 172 Spear Grass Flat – 23<sup>rd</sup> May and 25 July 1887
- Account fencing destroyed through gravel being removed by permission of County for road works from J Perriam, Home Hotel and Store Lowburn – 7 July 1887
