- Memorandum from the Surveyor-General's Office to the Chairman, Vincent County Council requesting a short general statement of the works done to open Crown Lands within the county during the year ended 30 June – 10 May 1883
- Telegraph from Vincent Pyke to Wellington (collect) re sections not taken or applied for in Block 10 and 11 Poolburn – 2 June 1881
- Letter from the General Survey Office to Vincent Pyke re lithographs of new block numbers of Mount Barker and Anderson blocks – 16 April 1880
- Telegraph from Surveyor General, James McKerrow, re modifications of Earnsclough Survey – 30 March 1880
- Telegraph from the Surveyor General, James McKerrow, to Vincent Pyke re Gazetted entries Poolburn, McLaren's and Lagoon Gully Block – 31 March 1880
- Telegraph from the Surveyor General, James McKerrow, to Vincent Pyke re Lagoon Gully Block, Poolburn Block, Vincent ? on McLeans run Block II Wanaka near Mt Barker and Anderson Block – 23 March 1880
- Telegraph Wellington (General Survey Office?) to Vincent Pyke informing that Mr Rolleston had left for the south and he could expect to see him in a fortnight to three weeks with a view to opening lands – 22 May 1880
- Telegraph from the Surveyor General, James McKerrow, to Vincent Pyke re "Survey of extra land at Earnsclough now ordered." – 6 January 1880
- Letter from the Crown Land Office, Dunedin acknowledging receipt of Vincent Pyke's letter calling attention to the delay in opening land for the settlement of Idaburn and Moutere – 10 July 1879
