- Letter from the New Zealand Constabulary, Inspectors Office recommending Sergeant Thomas Livingston of Cromwell be appointed an Inspector of Slaughter Houses 3 December 1885
- Letter from the New Zealand Constabulary, Inspectors Office recommending Constable John Walton, Ophir be appointed an Inspector of Slaughter Houses – 19 November 1885
- Payment and request for forms for a slaughtering license for small cattle for Ah Why of Conroys gully – June 1884
- Letter requesting a transfer of slaughtering license because of the purchase of a business at Quartzville – 21 June 1883
- Letter from William Williams withdrawing his application for a slaughter license in favour of applying for a slaughter license for his son – 4 July 1884
