Having up to 10 adult residents in Naseby would increase our population by 10% more if they have families. Having up to 300 extra people working and living in the Maniototo for 2 years plus would generate enough revenue to future proof our businesses. For that reason, we are pro the development of a solar farm in the Maniototo.

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
